SUPPORT OUR RESCUE

How can you make a difference?

\$20 - flea treatment for a cat or dog for one month OR five days worth of canned food for the community cat room

\$50 - one cat spay/neuter; OR one month of cat medications; OR one large bag of dog food; OR one month of litter for the cat room

\$100 - 5 cat or dog flea treatments for one month OR 1 dog spay/neuter OR one medicated bag of cat or dog food

\$500 - vaccines for 25 animals; OR 5 dog spay/neuters; OR one order of cat litter (a month to 3-month supply)
